Mrs Dorothy Saunders

Recently news was received of the death of Mrs Saunders, the wife of the Rev Campbell M Saunders who was first minister of the new St Bride's Church following the combination of the fabrics of St Columba's Church and St Andrew's Church completed in May 1958. She apparently had very happy memories of life in Newtonmore.

Some Old History

The death of Mrs Saunders prompted some research into the founding of St Bride's. The fabrics of the two buildings were combined following a substantial donation from a 'devoted and respected' member of the congregation who met three fifths of the cost! (Although I remember the church being constructed, I have no recollection of Miss I St Clare Douglas! Can anyone enlighten?).

It is also recorded that in May 1937, the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland disjoined Newtonmore from the parish of Kingussie and united St Columba's Church and St Andrew's Church (the former United Free) as the parish church of Newtonmore. From having been for many years the daughter—church of Kingussie, in 1975 Newtonmore became the sister-church of Laggan when the linkage was approved.

The bell from St Columba's Church still hangs in the St Bride's belfry and rings out every Sunday morning. However, it is no longer necessary to use a bell rope. Phew!

Badenoch Chorale

Practices started again on 14th August after the summer break and in the next few weeks we will be tidying up repertoire in advance of the next two concerts in Kingussie Church on Sunday 11th September at 7.00pm and Aberlour Church on Sunday 25th September at 6.30pm. Presbytery News

Negotiations to form a new presbytery for the Highlands go on and on with no conclusion yet on the horizon. Most of the current presbyteries are of one mind but as with many things, there are always dissenters.

Presbytery has a new moderator Rev Graham Atkinson, minister of Abernethy, Boat of Garten and Carrbridge. He took up office in June 2022 and will do this for a year.

Alvie Church by Loch Alvie has been sold to the Alvie estate and they will control its future use. Kincardine Church is likely also to leave the care of Abernethy Presbytery as it is intended that this should be part of a new charity.

Presbytery is still in consultation with the General Trustees regarding the future of the other churches in Presbytery and continuing delays in this procedure, which reflects on to the granting of permission to call new ministers, is a source of real frustration!




The Manse
