A new Minister -where are we?

We are STILL waiting to hear if we can call a minister! Following the General Assembly's decision in May 2021 to limit the number of ministers in each presbytery, Abernethy Presbytery submitted a Presbytery Mission Plan as approval of this was essential before we could call a minister. Presbytery set up a Mission Planning group to prepare the plan and set up the process following the departure of our minister and the Rev Gordon Strang at Grantown.

By February 2022, Presbytery had approved the third draft and this was submitted, only to find that an Asset Management Buildings Audit (AMBA) had to be completed for all the churches in the Presbytery before our plan could be considered! More delay! In June 2022, the recategorization of church buildings was discussed and in August the plan was submitted again. Then we had more questions from the Church of Scotland Presbytery Implementation Planning Group (PMPIG) and last month the Faith Nurture Forum approved our plan. So NEARLY there!

BUT the General Trustees were still unhappy about the buildings and wanted more buildings to be closed within five years so we could have no approval until this situation is resolved. Currently, we hope that the whole plan, including closure of buildings will be approved at the Presbytery meeting on 6th December to which congregations will be cited, with PMPIG approval following on 14th December. See 'Late News'.

We will then complete our parish profile, set up a nominating committee and start the process early in 2023. It has been a very lengthy and bureaucratic process with many frustrating delays. In the meantime, we are so grateful to Rev Mary Ellen Thomson for being our locum minister for all this time.

Rev Christine is already familiar to us having taken joint services for us in recent months and we look forward to having her with us in the coming months to lead our kirk Sessions and assist with the organisation of services.

Presbytery News

There is still an ongoing protracted debate on the formation of a Highland Presbytery and as things stand, this is not likely to happen soon. Rev James MacEwan has tendered his resignation as Presbytery Clerk with effect from mid-February 2023 and given the number of years he has carried out this task, he will be a big miss. The Business Committee have been tasked with finding a successor.

Communion

There will be a joint communion service for Laggan and Newtonmore in St Bride's on Sunday 11th December at 11-30a.m. The retiring offering will be for CrossReach.

Christmas Carols in Laggan

On Friday 9th December at 7-00p.m. there will be a 'Christmas Carols for Everyone' in Laggan Church. This will be followed by mince pies, coffee, mulled wine and soft drinks. All welcome.

Church Services

The Worship Group will shortly be meeting to discuss arrangements for services for the three months from 1st January 2023. Our prime objective has been and will continue to be to have services in all of our three churches as often as practical and we are grateful to Rev Michael Mair, Rev Christine Ritchie and Alison Bardgett who have taken our monthly services on the last Sunday of the month to give Rev Mary Ellen Thomson some Sundays off! We have also been reliant of members of the group taking services and this will continue certainly in Laggan and Newtonmore, but some additional pulpit supply may be required to sustain our objective over the winter period.

Late News

Subsequent to Beth Alder writing her article on the Presbytery Mission Plan, we received unexpected news from the General Trustees informing us, that at this late stage in the planning, they had downgraded Laggan Church to a B in the Presbytery Mission Plan which is now on the Agenda for discussion and probable approval at Presbytery on Tuesday 6th December 2022. Classification as a 'B' means 'ripe for disposal'. The full text of the Edict is:

Notice is hereby given that the Presbytery of Abernethy will consider and vote on the draft Presbytery Mission Plan on Tuesday 6th December. The Plan includes Laggan Church being 'sold, let or otherwise disposed of' by the end of 2025. The congregation is hereby cited to appear for its interests at the meeting which begins at 7-00p.m.

While this is disappointing, there will be positive news if Presbytery approves the plan as we will then be able to proceed with the mechanics of calling a new minister for Kingussie linked with Laggan and Newtonmore so this will be a big step forward, though maybe not without its complications!

Editor Comments

This news was unexpected, though to be fair, there have been some ideas in the background for the future, should this prove to be the situation. The church building has been downgraded on the basis that it did not have a kitchen or a toilet, and was currently only in use for Sunday services. The starting point for the future will be to find out the price at which the General Trustees are prepared to sell the building. Once this is known, options can be considered and appropriate steps hopefully taken to ensure that worship will continue to be available in the Laggan Community into the future.

Unfortunately, decisions on Presbytery Mission Plans are being considered on financial grounds and, without any realistic investigation, the fact that the Laggan Church building does not cost the Church of Scotland a penny, has been totally overlooked! The Church of Scotland itself may well be instigating its own decline by its current actions, but, as Christians we are empowered to spread the Gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ, irrespective of this, and hopefully we will be able to do this.

We are not alone in this situation and the church building at Loch Insh, Kincraig has been placed in the same category as ourselves. The Church of Scotland as an organisation is asset rich and income poor and sustaining ministry has become a real challenge for the future.
