In this, each presbytery has one vote so it will be interesting to see the conclusion as some are known to have voted against this relaxation.

The closure of Dulnain Bridge Church building was noted with regret. The congregation will still worship locally but the cost of building upgrading requirements was totally out with the ability of the small congregation.

Over £5,000 has been spent between our three churches on new equipment and technology supported by a grant of £4,000 from Abernethy Presbytery. He is a Church experience with external contributions, but more importantly there is an opportunity to make our churches community hubs by hosting other 'events'. To date Alvie church has been sold and the possibility of Kincardine and Inveravon moving to charitable trusts is currently being investigated.
